- 1). To be able to blend watercolours correctly in order to paint a still life 2&3). Understand how to accurately layer paint to create different tones of colour 4&5). Understand how to use scale and proportion when enlarging a piece of work 6). Understand how to add paint to objects in a still life piece of work 7&8). Understand how to layer paint to make objects look 3 dimensional
- 9). Understand how to enhance details on still life painting10). How to analyse the work of artists and designers from other genres

<u>Key Skills:</u> Drawing, painting, watercolour painting, shading, scale and proportion, artist analysis

Assessment Two:

Pupils will be assessed on their watercolour studies and how these have been applied onto a A3 gridded still life painting

Experimenting & Developing ideas: Michael Craig Martin still life piece

Learning Enquiries:

To be able to effectively use the grid method to create a piece of work in response to the artist Michael Craig Martin **3&4).** To be able to apply knowledge of colour theory when painting Michael Craig Martin drawing **5&6).** How to create a collage in the style of Michael Craig Martin **7&8).** How to create a drawing from collaged Michael Craig Martin piece **9&10).** How to select and apply colour to show understanding of Michael Craig Martin's work

<u>Key Skills:</u> Drawing, painting, collage, acrylic painting, scale and proportion, artist analysis,

Assessment Three:

Pupils will be assessed on the work they have created based on Michael Craig Martin and the analysis they have done

Learning Focus – Landscapes – Term 2 & 3



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Exploring:

Extended landscape drawings

Learning Enquiries: 1). Understand how to analyse a landscape **2&3).**To be able to create an extended landscape study using watercolours **4).** To be able to enhance details on extended landscape study using pen and pencil crayon **5).** To be able to use paint to create realistic sky studies **6).** To be able to create realistic studies of trees **7).** Landscape drawing utilising the skills learnt from above

Key Skills: sketchbook presentation skills, painting, drawing, perspective

Developing & Experimenting: Artist Studies 'David Hockney' and 'The Fauvists'

Learning Enquiries: 13). Explore colour and texture when using oil pastels 14.)Know how to create work in response to the artist David Hockney 15). Be able to present a page in sketchbook on the artist David Hockney 16). Be able to explore the use of photoshop to edit landscape images to reflect the 'Fauvist's' style of work 17&18). Know how to present a page in sketchbook based on the 'Fauvists'
