Unit 1: Young Voices: I Am Malala

Unit 2: Villains and the influence of Literature: Richard III

How can I identify and write about literary devices effectively? 4. How important is stagecraft and what makes a play different to prose? <p><u>Key Skills:</u> Knowledge, analysis, summarising</p>	<p>Interim Assessment: Pupils will have one piece of key scene analysis marked with specific feedback that will allow them to respond and improve a specific area.</p> <p>Final Assessment: This assessment will test for spelling, knowledge and ability to use short, apt quotations.</p>
Unit 3: Exploration of the gothic

What is mood and atmosphere in a text? How can I create my own moods and atmospheres? 3. How does the style of narration create tension? 4. How can I apply my knowledge of literary devices for effect in my own writing? <p><u>Key Skills:</u> Knowledge, analysis, descriptive writing, comparison</p>	<p>Interim Assessment: Pupils will have one piece of gothic analysis marked with specific feedback that will allow them to respond and improve a specific area.</p> <p>Final Assessment: This assessment will test for spelling, knowledge and ability to use genre conventions for effect.</p>
Unit 4: Adventure from another world: Trash by Andy Mulligan

How can I compare feelings around experiences and places in poems?</p> <p><u>Key Skills:</u> Knowledge, analysis, comparison</p>	<p>Interim Assessment: Pupils will have one piece of analytical writing marked with specific feedback that will allow them to respond and improve a specific area.</p> <p>Final Assessment: This assessment will test for spelling, knowledge and ability to compare the effects of language in two poems.</p>
